#### 1. PROJECT DECISIONS AND PROPOSALS

- 1.1 Increase Access to Environmental Training by Removing Barriers to Participation (Kwikwetlem First Nation)
  - The Committee approved the proposal with no amendments.
  - Kyle Robertson, IAMC-TMX Indigenous Caucus Technical Advisor, was recused from all correspondence and deliberations regarding this decision.
  - The proposal sought funding to reduce barriers to participating in two courses: (1) an 8-week environmental monitoring course delivered by Kwantlen Polytechnic University (KPU), and (2) a 1-week RISC archeological monitoring training course. The proposal would enable unemployed and underemployed Indigenous participants to complete training that will improve their skills and ability to take advantage of employment opportunities related to monitoring the Trans Mountain Expansion Project (TMX).
